Community Asset Mapping

Carry out classic Bonner community asset mapping in your first days in Ghana. It will begin with your visit to Elmina Slave Castle. It will continue when we break out into small groups led by a TOB staffer and sponsored youth to take a deeper look in to Ghanaian society by visiting:

- Nana Hima Dekyi Rural Hospital to explore the healthcare system.
- Takoradi District Courts and Police Station to learn about social services.
- Agona Market & Local Resorts gaining an understanding of the economy.
- Busua Methodist Primary for an in-depth look at the lives of students, the focus of our work



Youth Outreach

In the final days of your stay you will set the stage for years to come by proctoring standardized tests and collecting crucial data during after school sessions with primary students.

This information will be used by future educators better reach and teach students. This impactful project is the basis of the Bonners development with Teach on the Beach. Not to mention, building this database will help Teach on the Beach design more effective outreach for all volunteers.





All trips are staffed by seasoned Teach on the Beach staffers with a combined decade of experience working, teaching, and living in Ghana. Students will stay at the Alaska Beach Club next door to TOB facilities and will be supervised at all time by TOB and Alaska Beach Club staff.
