Daily Teach on the Beach Volunteer Programming



Teach at the Busua Primary School (~8 to 12pm)

Teaching in the primary school is crucial to building relationships with students and teachers and makes our organization's focus on education highly visible in the community.

- Aid teachers with daily lessons and managing their classrooms
- Substitute when teachers are absent, which can be often
- Gain valuable experience working in a difficult situation



After School Programs (2pm – 4pm)

Keep your students learning for an extra hour or two on weekdays at the Teach on the Beach resource room.

- Explore students creativity with arts, music, storytelling or other non-traditional teaching
- Work on problem areas with specific students to help them gain confidence
- Use your own knowledge and experience in science, math, writing, the arts, etc. to open up the students' minds



NewsHour (6pm - 8pm)

NewsHour is designed to help secondary students learn about new people, ideas, and cultures while building their discussion and writing skills. Teach on the Beach coordinates NewsHour groups around the world in a truly innovative global conversation.

- Facilitate and grow our daily discussions in Busua
- Help students with the summary and reflection reports
- Correspond with NewsHour facilitators worldwide to organize virtual discussions
