PLACEMENT OVERVIEW

Fellowship Position Title: Research to Practice Fellow

Fellowship Position Summary: CIRCLE's Research to Practice Fellow will work to translate research and lessons learned about integrating social media with service and about youth civic engagement, creating new useful tools for Bonner Programs. This might include reflection guides, trainings, fliers, blog posts, and other fact sheets that can strengthen Bonner's integration with nationally recognized trends and research. Under the guidance of a lead CIRCLE researcher, the Fellow will create new ways to integrate the best practices for youth civic engagement, including topics like political participation, voting and public education. This is an ideal position for someone interested in curriculum and program development, as well as the national civic engagement field.

Specific Position Activities:

- 1) Translate lessons and findings from Bonner's experimentation with social media (Serve 2.0) into new resource material, online strategies, and tools for Bonner Programs. For example this might include by developing short trainings, reflections, blog posts, tweets, videos, content for the Bonner wiki, and Facebook posts;
- 2) Translate research about youth civic engagement (i.e., voting, factors for successful programs, advocacy, other forms of civic and political engagement) into information and tools to share with campuses in the Bonner Network and beyond. Currently, the research is in the forms of papers, handbooks, and reports and offers rich content for colleges and university use; and
- 3) Work with CIRCLE staff as needed to identify relevant information and communicate new research findings. The fellow will create fact sheets, structured reflections, and others informational materials.

PREFERRED EXPERIENCES

Familiarity with creating videos (i.e. Bonner Video Project or other initiatives) and instructional technologies; Experience in leading trainings and/or reflections; Experience working with video or other technologies; Worked in a program management role (i.e. Bonner Intern or Site Coordinator); Ability to be creative (i.e. fliers or plan an on-line event).
