PLACEMENT OVERVIEW

Fellowship Position Title: Outreach and Development Fellow

Fellowship Position Summary: The Outreach and Development Fellow aim will be to work on the increase of traffic to the Pulitzer reporting projects and to expand the debate around international issues. The Fellow will do this by creating outreach material which will include a newsletter, maintaining the Pulitzer Center website and research on international policy. The Fellow will also work to deepen the existing relationship between the Pulitzer Center and the Bonner Network in particular, identifying and connecting talented journalists who have an interest in global concerns and documenting them.

Specific Position Activities:

- 1) development of university engagement and outreach materials;
- 2) research on international policy;
- 3) development of international perspective opportunities for Bonner engagement nation-wide; and
- 4) management of Pulitzer Center website, newsletter and social media platforms (i.e. Facebook, Twitter and Tumblr)

AGENCY DESCRIPTION

The Center's educational programs provide students with fresh information on global issues, help them think critically about the creation and dissemination of news, and inspire them to become active consumers and producers of information.

The Pulitzer Center's hybrid journalism and educational non-profit model treats news coverage of systemic global issues as media campaigns. The Center applies its model to maintain a spotlight on often ignored issues, ranging from water and food insecurity to women and children in crisis and the local costs of global commodities.

DESIRED CANDIDATE QUALIFICATIONS

All Bonner Fellows

Bonner Fellows will represent some of the most standout students across the Bonner Network, ideally rising juniors and seniors with previous summer internship experience and interested in building their professional network, who demonstrate:

- commitment to the Bonner Program model and its core values (i.e. the Common Commitments);
- passion for social justice, service, and civic engagement;
- excellent organization, written and oral communication, and analytical skills;
- ability to work autonomously and in team settings;
- readiness for a capstone-level project;
- effective time management skills; and
- a motivated, focused, reliable self-starter.

REQUIRED SKILLS

Multimedia skills (video, photography and audio); Knowledge of AP style; Interest or familiarity with international affairs

PREFERRED EXPERIENCES

Campus engagement particularly related to international issues and/ or media production (i.e. student newspaper); Basic web development and maintenance skills (Drupal experience a plus) and experience in web presence and digital communication strategies; Experience with event planning, outreach, marketing strategies and fundraising.

ADDITIONAL CONSIDERATIONS FOR THIS POSITION

AmeriCorps (NO): This position is ineligible for AmeriCorps, because of its focus on international issues.

Funding: Check with your Bonner Director and Coordinator to determine if you have any Bonner Scholar or Leader funds that could be used to assist your living costs for this summer. We recommend that all applicants aim to secure \$3500 in funding for the summer in order to live comfortably. You may need to raise some or all of these funds on your own.

Housing: You will need to relocate to Washington DC. Fellows are expected to secure and manage their own housing for the duration of the term.
