PLACEMENT OVERVIEW

Fellowship Position Title: Outreach & Engagement Fellow

Fellowship Position Summary: The Outreach & Engagement Fellow will work with the Campus Network team in strategic planning, program development, curriculum design, and outreach activities to further connect the Bonner Network and the Roosevelt Institute Campus Network. The Fellow will be charged with the responsibility of supporting campuses with both Bonner and Roosevelt chapters, while also identifying Bonner campuses where a Roosevelt chapter may fit in. The Fellow will build a system of engagement, series of trainings, and structure for Bonner-Roosevelt campuses, producing a comprehensive set of outcomes and expectations for institutions that host both a Bonner program and a Roosevelt chapter. The main goal is to leverage these programs to build the relationship between direct service and policy/advocacy on a campus, as well as strengthen the competencies of students to engage across both sets of activities. Additionally, the Fellow will engage in related outreach and program development for the macro-level Bonner-Roosevelt partnership, such as mutual involvement in national conferences, building off the the Bonner Blueprint for America work, and getting Bonners to the Roosevelt Hyde Park Leadership Conference.

Specific Position Activities:

1) develop a model of engagement for Bonner-Roosevelt programs on college campuses;

- 2) identify and support campuses that can host such a collaboration;
- 3) create systems, processes, and outreach materials that will institutionalize the partnership; and4) assist Roosevelt Institute Campus Network in outreach and programming across Bonner Schools.

ADDITIONAL CONSIDERATIONS FOR THIS POSITION

AmeriCorps (NO): This position is not eligible for AmeriCorps because of its focus on supporting students to engage in political advocacy.

Funding: Check with your Bonner Director and Coordinator to determine if you have any Bonner Scholar or Leader funds that could be used to assist your living costs for this summer. We recommend that all applicants aim to secure \$3500 in funding for the summer in order to live comfortably. You may need to raise some or all of these funds on your own.

Housing: You will need to relocate to New York City. Fellows are expected to secure and manage their own housing for the duration of the term.
