PLACEMENT OVERVIEW

Fellowship Position Title: Program Management & Outreach Fellow

Fellowship Position Summary: The Program Management & Outreach Fellow will work closely with the Bonner Foundation Program Associate to help coordinate the development of Bonner Foundation's first summer Fellowship Program in New York City and Washington D.C. The Fellow will be responsible for coordinating Bonner site visits in both cities, the development and management of a weekly newsletter and social media platforms (i.e. Facebook, Twitter, and the Bonner Blog.) In addition, the Fellow will also serve as the first point of contact for summer Bonner Fellows in the program to assist with any logistical questions Fellows may have about the program. During this time the Bonner Fellow will have a unique opportunity to work closely with other Bonner Foundation staff to help organize other high-level projects and meetings for the network.

Specific Position Activities:

- 1) serve as first point of contact for Bonner Fellows participating in the program;
- 2) work with Program Associate to organize and coordinate Bonner site visits, visit agenda and other logistics to DC and NYC;
- 3) create Bonner Fellows Summer Newsletter; and
- 4) manage and update Bonner network social media platforms
